Grassy Narrows River Run

On Wednesday, Planned Parenthood Toronto was honoured to be invited to participate in the Grassy Narrows River Run Rally, in solidarity with <u>Grassy Narrows First Nation</u> and their long fight for mercury poisoning justice. An estimated 8,000 supporters, from members of the Grassy Narrows, to children and youth from schools, to environmental justice and land defense organizations, to healthcare service providers and unions, took to the streets to draw attention to this half-century long injustice. Mining, logging, and pollution have had devastating impacts on the water, land, and lives of the people of Grassy Narrows. PPT stands in firm solidarity with Indigenous peoples' rights to make autonomous decisions about what happens to their land, and is grateful to all those who made yesterday's powerful rally and protest possible.

<u>UofT Students for Choice</u> is a pro-choice club at the University of Toronto, advocating for an individual's right to make autonomous decisions about their own body. Their Rapid Response Team helps keep students safe by mobilizing against graphic imagery on campus. They also table at club fairs, attend protests, and share information about reproductive justice and abortion rights. UofT Students for Choice was a <u>2022 recipient</u> of Planned Parenthood Toronto's Choice Awards and is a phenomenal example of the work young people are doing in our sector!

Toronto Indigenous Harm Reduction (TIHR) is a queer and Two-Spirit run initiative supported by countless volunteers which fills a gap left by a lack of frontline services that meet the basic needs for Indigenous folks in Toronto. TIHR provides access to critical health support and COVID-19 testing, harm reduction supplies, sexual, reproductive health and prenatal support, traditional medicines, traditional food, expressive arts, and ceremony to vulnerable Indigenous folks in Tkaronto (Toronto). PPT has profound gratitude for the community care work TIHR does.

<u>Cover ContraceptiON</u> is a grassroots campaign which has a goal of providing universal, no-cost contraception to all those in Ontario. The Cover ContraceptiON campaign started at the beginning of the pandemic, when a group of doctors at the University of Toronto recognised that the COVID-19 pandemic was intensifying pre-existing inequities among marginalized populations – those of low socioeconomic status, cultural minorities, Black and Indigenous peoples, and residents of rural communities. We love the advocacy and resource-sharing work they do!
